

INTERNATIONAL GOLF TOURNEY.

Miss Abbott of Chicago Takes First Prize for Women Players at Paris.

PARIS, Oct. 5.—The International Golf Competition at Compiègne, in connection with the Paris Exposition, was concluded yesterday. In the ladies' championship, where there were ten entries, the results were as follows: First, Miss Abbott of Chicago, 47; second, Miss P. Whittier of St. Moritz, 49; third, Mrs. Huger Pratt of Dinard, 53, and Mme. Froment Maurice of Compiègne, 53; fourth, Mrs. Ridgeway of d'Euville, 57, and sixth, Mme Fournier Sarloveze of Compiègne, 64.

In the Men's Handicap, where there were twenty-nine entries, the following were the results: First, A. B. Lambert of Paris, 73; second, P. Deschamps of Paris, 75; third, Lord of Dinard, 81; fourth, G. Thorne of Weston-super-Mare, 84, and Mackenzie Turpie of Scotland, 84; and fifth, W. B. Dove of England, 85.
